
Continuous & Comprehensive Evaluation (C.C.E.)

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- Continuous and comprehensive evaluation (CCE) is a method of evaluating the student's performance to understand the points of improvement in their progress. It involves regular tests and evaluations for better student performance.
- It treats evaluation as a developmental process.

CCE and RTE

The Right to Education Act of India mandated the Continuous and **Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE)** assessment method in **2009**. The **Central Board of Secondary Education** in India and the state governments of India introduced this assessment proposal for sixth-through tenth-grade pupils.



What is CCE

Continuous and Comprehensive evaluation include two terms

Continuous and **Comprehensive**

continuous term is used to denote that the evaluation will not be and incident , but will continue as a process

comprehensive term is used for the notion that the evaluation unlike earlier methods will not limit to the scholastic achievement only but will also include vast area of development.


Objectives of CCE

- Evaluate and guide the students in all aspects of education
- Improve learning outcomes by focusing on skills and cognitive abilities of students
- Encourage regular assessment and constructive criticism
- Reduce stress and pressure on students
- Provide a tool for detection & corrections.
- Enables teacher for prolific teaching

Features of CCE

- CCE focuses on scholastic as well as co scholastic areas. (<u>all around development</u>)
- It employs multiple techniques of evaluation. It includes written examination, oral examination, sessional work,
 participation in activities performance in programmes etc,.
- The concept of **periodicity** means at the end of the targeted unit of learning, using criterion reference tests.

Scholastic area and CCE Scholastic area means the curricular aspect or the subjects prescribed for the very grade.



Scholastic Areas (Procedure)

- It include formative as well as summative assessment
- The formative assessment consists of diagnostic testing.
- It typically involves qualitative feedback for both student and teacher
- It is commonly compared with summative assessment, which attempts to monitor educational outcomes, often for purposes of external responsibility

- Personal Social Qualities : Cleanliness, Cooperation , Punctuality, Discipline, Responsibility, Tolerance , Civic Sense, Social Service, Dignity For Labour, Protection Of Environment, Etc....

Co-Scholastic Areas (Procedure)

- Individual assessment: This includes any activity or task which is performed by any student individually.
- Group assessment: This includes any single project or assignment that is assigned to a group of students wherein they collaborate and complete the task.
- Self-assessment: Based on given criteria the students are supposed to evaluate their progress, understanding of subjects, knowledge, and skills, etc.
- Peer-assessment: In this particular assessment students are paired in a group wherein one student assesses the work of another.
